



**6X6 360 Hunting Blind
Owner's Manual**

1. Installation and Setup:

Follow the manufacturer's instructions for assembling and installing the hunting blind. Ensure that it is securely anchored to the ground or tree and properly stabilized to prevent falls.

- c.) Do not stay in an elevated hunting blind during a lightning storm.

5. Weather Awareness:

Stay informed about the weather conditions in your hunting area before and during your hunt. Use a weather radio or smartphone app to monitor weather updates.

6. Safety Harness and Gear:

Always wear a safety harness while in, ascending, or descending an elevated hunting blind, just like a tree stand. It can prevent falls and serious injuries.

7. Buddy System:

Whenever possible, hunt with a buddy or let someone know your hunting plans and expected return time. This can be crucial for safety in case of an emergency.

8. Regular Inspections:

Periodically inspect the hunting blind for any signs of wear, damage, or structural issues. Repair or replace any damaged components promptly.

9. Fire Safety:

If you plan to use heating equipment, such as a portable heater, in the blind, take precautions to prevent fire hazards. Keep flammable materials away from heating sources.

10. First Aid Kit:

Always carry a basic first aid kit in case of minor injuries. Be prepared to provide first aid to yourself or others if necessary.
